



Just the Facts

Fully Expanded and Renovated Library

MORE SPACE: The existing building is 20,000 square feet. The addition is 16,000 square feet, increasing the size of the building by 75% ... The new addition will complement the existing architecture (brick and stone), with the integration of large windows ... RENOVATIONS: Complete renovation of space and traffic flow in existing library; one central circulation desk; all necessary basic systems (roofs, windows, etc.) will be repaired or renovated, and all code problems will be rectified ... BETTER USE/FLEXIBILITY OF SPACE: Expanded areas will be used for books, periodicals, reading, new quiet rooms for study, and all of the following ... TECH-NOLOGY. Comprehensive computer services including an enclosed computer room, complete hardwiring and full automation (checkout, electronic card catalog) for the building ... EXPANDED CHILDREN'S LIBRARY: More books and reading room, separate children's program room and storytime room. SEPARATE AREAS FOR YOUNG ADULTS AND PRIME TIME (SENIOR CITIZENS): All for use with collections and services specific to these age groups ... EXPANDED A/V: More space for videos, CDs, books on tape, etc. ... LARGER MEETING ROOM: The meeting room will be expanded from a maximum capacity of 100 to 200; it will also be dividable, enabling multiple events to be staged at the same time ... ACCESSIBILITY: The building will be fully accessible to patrons with disabilities ... PARKING: On-site patron parking adjacent to the rear entrance ... CONVENIENT BOOK DROP.

East Northport:

A New, Larger Library on Same Site

NEW LIBRARY IS MUCH LARGER: The existing building is 8,500 square feet. The new library is 20,000 square feet, an increase of nearly 150% in space; the new addition will reflect the architecture of the old library — it will be built of brick with pitched roofs and a fireplace. MORE SPACE MEANS BETTER SERVICES: Expanded book collection, periodicals, separate quiet study rooms, and the following: TECHNOL-OGY: Comprehensive computer services including an enclosed computer room, complete hardwiring and full automation (checkout, electronic card catalog) for the building ... EXPANDED CHILDREN'S LIBRARY: Will have separate children's program room and parent resource center ... SEPARATE AREAS FOR YOUNG ADULTS AND PRIME TIME (SENIOR CITIZENS): All for use with collections and services specific to these age groups ... EXPANDED A/V: More space for videos, CDs, books on tape, etc. ... MEETING

ROOM: Current building does not have a meeting room; new library will have a meeting room for 100 ... ACCESSIBILITY: The building will be fully accessible to patrons who are disabled ... PARKING: Renovation of existing lot and shared parking for ball fields will provide extensive parking ... COMMUNITY PRIDE: This new, larger library is a piece of civic architecture that East Northport residents will take pride in, as it adds to the character of the community ... CONVENIENT BOOK DROP.

Suffolk County Board of Elections Registration: Anyone registered and eligible to vote in the general elections is permitted to vote in the library elections as well. However, you must be registered with the Suffolk County Board of Elections at least ten (10) days prior to the date of the vote.

School District Registration: You can register to vote at any district school between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. when school is in session or at the Office of the District Clerk, located in the Northport High School from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on weekdays. You must register with the school district at least five (5) days prior to the date of the vote. Registration is permanent as long as you vote once in each four-year period. In addition, a special registration day will be held on September 11, from 3 p.m. to 8 p.m. at the Northport Public Library building.

ABSENTEE BALLOTS:

If you wish to use an absentee ballot in a district election, you must submit a completed Absentee Ballot application to the District Clerk. This application may be requested by mail no later than September 11, which is seven days prior to the vote or in person no later than 5 pm the day before the election. Upon approval of the application a ballot will be issued. All absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk by 5 pm on the day of the election. Persons designated by the Suffolk County Board of Election as "permanently disabled" pursuant to provisions of the Election Law will automatically receive an absentee ballot, and need not apply.




