



BOOK & SANDWICH (W)RAP



PRETTY & PRACTICAL: A WORKSHOP IN ORIGAMI



Information Trustee Petitions

The Board of Trustees has

set the annual library vote for April 10, 1995. Voting will be for two purposes: to vote on the library budget for 1995/96 and to elect two trustees whose terms will commence on July 1, 1995. One term, which will be for five years, is presently held by Chairperson C. Annette Carr. The other, which will be for three years, is to fill the unexpired term of Jennifer Richmond who resigned in April 1994. It is presently held by Board appointed trustee, Nancy Schuman.

Petitions for nominating candidates for the office of trustee of the Northport-East Northport Public Library will be available at the Library from the office of the Library Clerk beginning February 15, Monday through Friday, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. The last filing date is March 10.



ADVICE FROM OUR ABLE ADVISORS

Our ABLE ADVISORS were introduced to the community in the November newsletter. This talented group of community members was formed to look at ways to increase access to the library and its resources. ABLE ADVISOR Concetta Pipia met with Library Director Stephanie Heineman, Assistant Director Eileen Minogue, and Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Architectural Consultant Todd Harvey in mid-December. The purpose of the meeting was to gain input from Ms. Pipia about her building analysis completed in November.

Ms. Pipia shared how she relies on the library yet it is so difficult for her to use. She concurs that our present "reasonable accommodations"

assist patrons with disabilities, but that the library cannot fully comply with ADA until a building renovation project is undertaken. While the main interior problem is in "flow," which cannot be corrected until we have more space, Ms. Pipia expressed satisfaction with the staff helping her to retrieve materials from inaccessible areas. Other areas of the discussion included:

- parking for patrons who have disabilities
- walks leading to the building.
- the front and foyer doors
- security system equipment.
- signage
- circulation desk congestion
- restrooms



Kudos to Concetta for suggesting a doorbell be installed to assist persons who have mobility impairments in entering the building. A bell at the front entrance to the Northport building has been installed for your use. When you alert us by ringing this bell, we will be happy to help you!
