



From Bach to Curie she read them all. Books and words excite Mrs. McGrail. If she looks up a word in the dictionary, she is soon lost within its pages. As a child, the *Grolier Societies Book of Knowledge* became Mrs. McGrail's best friend. This encyclopedia, though outdated, still holds a prominent and permanent position in her personal library. Mrs. McGrail had a library card as soon as she was eligible. Once a week, she and her mother made the 1/2 hour subway ride to the Brooklyn Public Library.



Mrs. McGrail is a registered nurse who specialized in emergency room care and nursing administration. Her alma maters include Packard Collegiate Institute in Brooklyn Heights and St. John Baptist School in Mendham, New Jersey. She worked at St. John's Episcopal Hospital in Brooklyn, Huntington Hospital, Good Samaritan Hospital, and the VA Medical Center in Northport. She was also a BOCES school nurse.

Mrs. McGrail is active in the community, the schools, and her church. She and her husband Herb have lived in Northport for 33 years and raised their children Cheryl, Herb, and Susan here in Northport. She has three grandchildren. Her interests include sewing, quilting, and cooking. Her hobbies — reading and going to the beach and . . . reading on the beach. Betsy McGrail says, "It is a privilege to serve on the Library Board.
