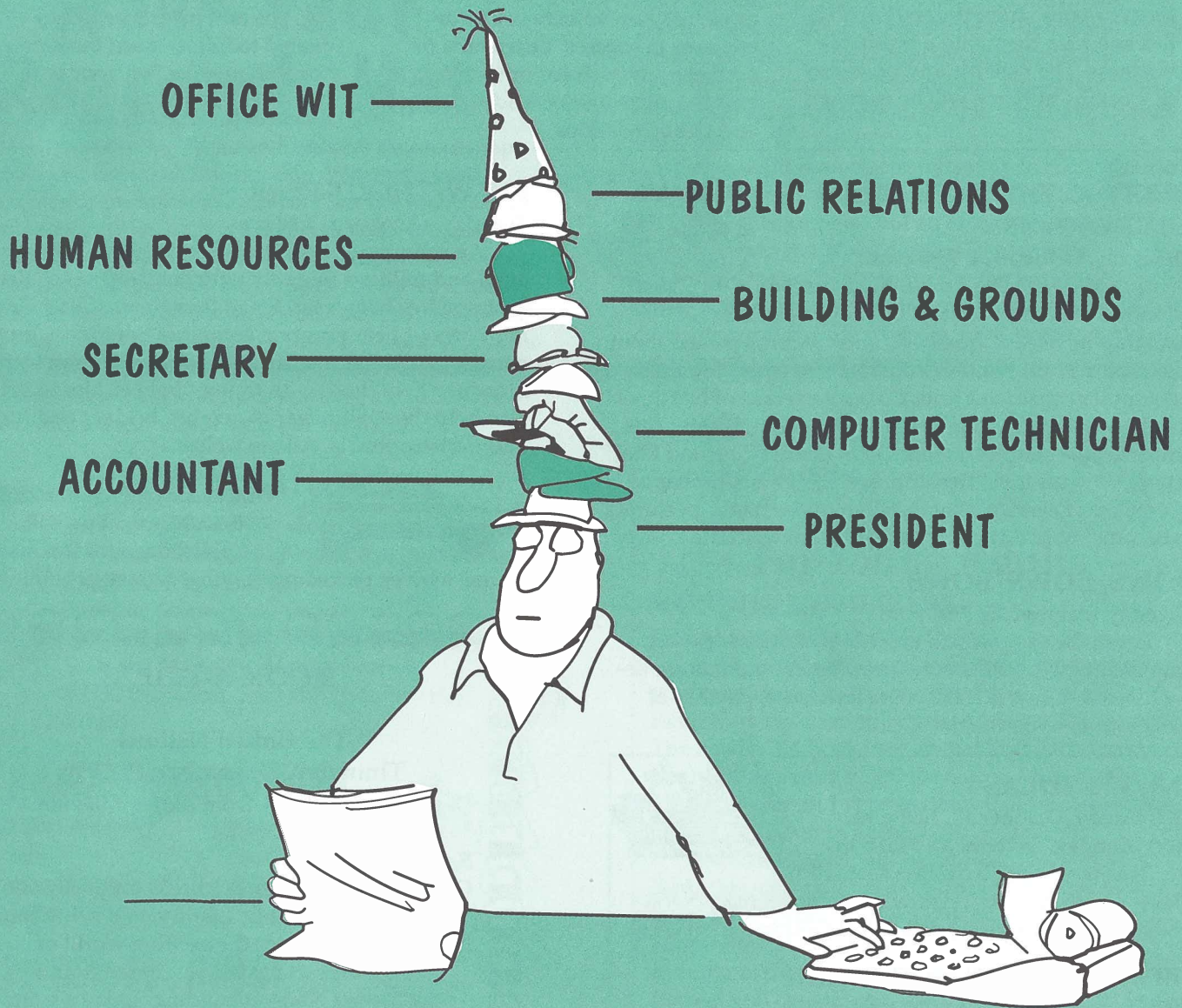

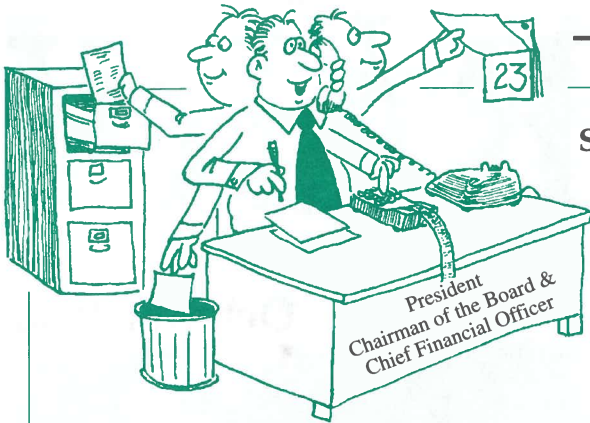



**YA BOOK REVIEWERS**

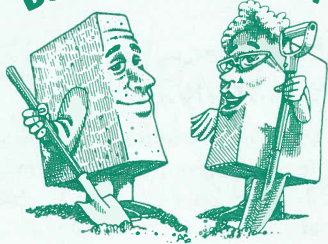
Friday, October 11, 4:00-5:00 p.m.

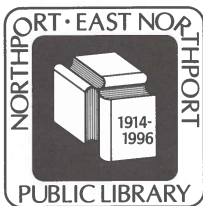

# Grants Awarded to Library Will Enhance Building Project

One of only three Suffolk County public libraries awarded New York State Construction Aid dollars this year, the Northport-East Northport Public Library has been granted more than half the money made available to this region. As our library administrators continue to identify ways to increase access to the library's resources for all patrons, this \$25,000 award will go toward projects designed to make services and resources more available in both library buildings for persons with disabilities.

This New York State Construction Aid application was the second successful 1996 grant proposal submitted by the library. In early August, the library received a \$74,096 LSCA Title II Construction grant. Together with Library Director Stephanie Heineman, the library trustees are determining how the \$74,096 can best be used in the new children's services areas.
