




### From the Director

The charge from the Library Board of Trustees in preparing this year's budget was to combine economy of spending, efficiency of operation, and effectiveness of service. Careful planning and evaluation result in a budget which requests an increase in spending over last year by 4.7% or approximately \$8.00 (for a house assessed at \$4,000). Your community is one of the few on Long Island offering library service in two buildings and it is noteworthy that this increase is modest considering the inherent costs of operating two libraries. Please review the budget document on the inside flap of this Newsletter. It is not merely a list of columns and numbers. It is a living document which breathes life into your library and enables us to continue our tradition of what will be in June 1994 the beginning of our 80th year of library service to the Northport-East Northport community.



There is a slight decrease next year in spending for those materials which require shelving. Space constraints alone have driven this decision. Spending for software housed on computers will increase.



The increase in patron borrowing has necessitated the increase in circulation control.



Cost of fuels, utilities, maintenance supplies, which are determined by the market place, have increased.



Debt service on the construction of the Northport building in 1966 has now been satisfied. Therefore, this item no longer reflects in our budget or the school's budget for 1994/95.



Finally, a reminder, this is a proposed budget which will maintain the library's continued day-to-day operation. It does not address our pressing building needs. When the Library Board determines their recommended course of action, they will come to you for discussion after which a separate referendum will be scheduled.

The tax pie on the Newsletter's cover illustrates how small an investment in your community your library tax dollars are. Library patrons will agree that this sliver really delivers!

The vote is Monday, April 11, 1994. I hope to see you there.




