Celebrate National Literacy Day on July 2.

A literate society is essential to the success of our nation

Librarians are leaders in promoting literacy and are actively engaged in numerous efforts to encourage people of all ages to read

The Northport-East Northport Public Library is proud to be involved in the Literacy Volunteer Program. We commend our many literacy tutors for the time and effort they have given toward this increasingly important goal of literacy.

Reading is a basic key to achieving personal success in school, in business, and in life

Patrons interested in joining the fight against illiteracy can become literacy volunteers. Patrons new to reading and in need of tutoring should ask a librarian about the Literacy Volunteer Program. Tutor and student applications are available at the reference desks at either building. Literacy volunteers are trained and assigned students by coordinators at our Suffolk Cooperative Library System. Students and tutors work one-to-one and can reserve meeting space for tutoring sessions at the library.

Libraries ensure equal access to knowledge and information and offer valuable reading resources and services . . .

The library has received recognition in the community for innovative efforts in promoting reading beyond library doors with the READ, RIDE, AND RETURN program. Many patrons commuting to New York City find that travel time is best spent reading. Paperback books provided by the library are available in the lobby of the Northport LIRR station. "Book" your next trip on the train with a paperback from the READ, RIDE AND RETURN rack.

Other library literacy outreach efforts include our HOMEWARD BOUND BOOKS SERVICE and HOSPITAL VISITATION PROGRAM.

Read to succeed, read for the fun of it, and promote literacy by being a reader.

THE ADULT LEARNER LITERACY COLLECTION



A special collection of library materials is available for our literacy volunteers and adult patrons new to reading. Dictionaries, vocabulary builders, and books about day-to-day activities are the core of this collection. Adult Basic Education (ABE) materials are useful to adult patrons building reading skills. Non-native adult patrons becoming familiar with our language utilize the English as a Second Language (ESL) resources.

The **Janus Survival Vocabulary Books** help readers with the language of daily living. These books deal with practical matters such as applying for a job; discussing medical concerns with a physician; placing an order at a restaurant; and shopping at the supermarket or department store.

A series published by **Contemporary's Choices** focuses on *Families and Schools; Housing; In Good Health; and It's Your Right*.

A **Feelings Illustrated** series interweaves photographs and text to depict *Loving; Working; Playing; and Laughing*. These books include activities and discussion topics to help readers learn.

Number Power: The Real World of Adult Math is a series that will help the reader master mathematical matters. Addition, subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions, decimals and percents, algebra, graphs, tables, maps and word problems are clearly explained. Included also is a handbook that tells how to use a calculator most effectively.

The new adult reader hooked on reading will want to spend leisure hours reading for pleasure. The library's literacy collection includes many books that will catch the imaginations of patrons improving reading skills. Some of these books are accompanied by read-along tapes that help readers with pronunciation. Books by contemporary authors and timeless classics, myths, and legends round out the collection.

Videos are also available to help the adult reader learn new skills. Titles include *I Want to Read* and *You Can Read*. A new set of "English as a Second Language" videos for basic and intermediate learners will be arriving soon.

News for You is a weekly newspaper with current events in an easy-to-read format. Extra copies are available for patrons to keep.

All literacy materials are located in the Prime Time Lounge of the Northport building. Books circulate for 28 days and videos for 14 days.

Can you imagine what it would be like if you couldn't read? For fun . . . Wouldn't it be terrible? And I'll bet half the Americans out there have never read a book for fun.

The Library Public Relations Council, founded more than 50 years ago, is an international organization that promotes the development of effective public relations skills for library public relations practitioners.

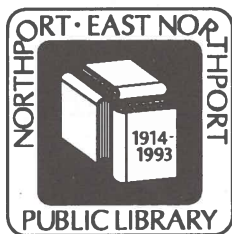
The judges thought our entry was "excellent in its design, layout, delivery of information, and a very effective public relations tool to generate interest in the library."
