

Willis Osborn. Bring your calculator. For the first time in twenty years, the PSAT and SAT examinations will change, reflecting current trends in academic thinking. The Class of 1995 will be the first to take the newly-revised tests, beginning with the PSAT in October.

To help you prepare, the library is offering a four-session course designed to sharpen your math and verbal skills. Instructors Willis L. Osborn (verbal) and Maryann Martinucci (math) have successfully tutored scores of students in preparation for these two standardized tests. Registration, which will be limited, begins September 2 in both library buildings.



We're Connected — "It's At The Branch"

BRANCH

LIBRARY

On Larkfield Road, 1.5 miles south of the Northport Library, is the East Northport Branch Library. We're connected, and while there is some duplication, in many respects each collection is unique.

MAIN The East Northport Branch Library has an LIBRARY extensive collection of books for gardening and culinary pursuits, as well as an enticing paperback collection of the latest titles and all-time favorites. The East Northport Branch has the resources to answer MAIN LIBRARY basic reference questions while the Northport Library is prepared to support your more intense research needs. The video, compact disc, and books- ontape collections for the two buildings are completely distinct. You'll see familiar faces at each library. Most of our staff members serve the public at both buildings and are ready to help you locate the library materials you need regardless of where they may be housed.

When browsing the card catalog at the main library in

Northport, you will see some cards marked with an **EN** indicating that the item is housed at the LIBRARY branch library. The East Northport card catalog includes books housed at Northport and the cards for those titles are marked with an N. If you frequent the

Branch and want an item from the Northport building, a librarian will call to have that item transferred to the Branch. The same is true, if you are at Northport and want an item from East

Northport. This is a next-day service.

Our central concern is to provide our patrons with optimal library service. While a branch library is not the most efficient way to accommodate changes technology and library materials, it allows us to divide the collection in a manner that utilizes the available space between the two buildings. Until a solution is derived for the space shortages experienced in both buildings, we appreciate your endurance when you hear, "It's at the Branch."




