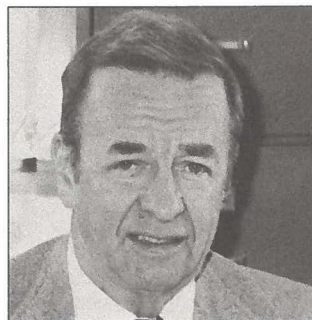

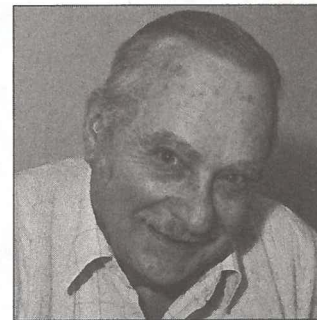

Mondays, June 15 & 22, 10:00 a.m. - 2:30 p.m.

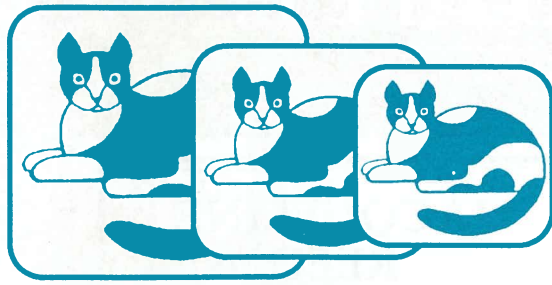
(half-hour break; please bring your lunch, beverages will be provided.)

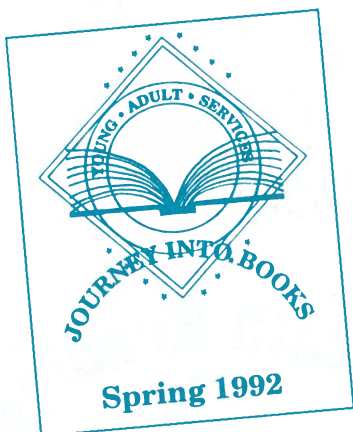

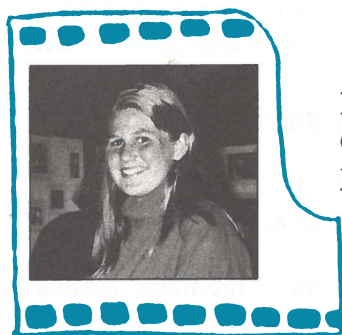

Family: Husband, children, and assorted beautiful grandchildren

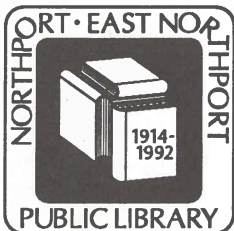
