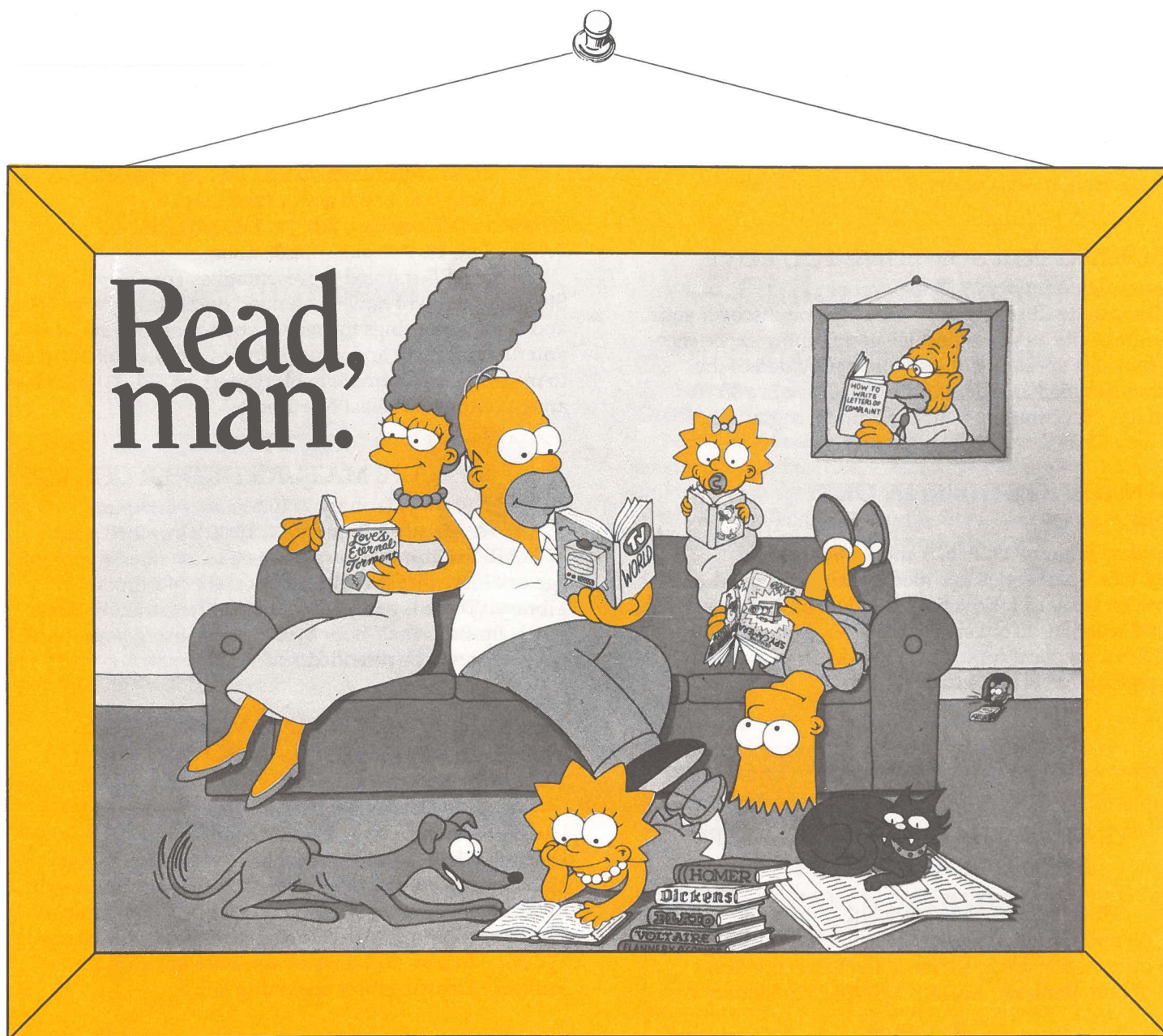

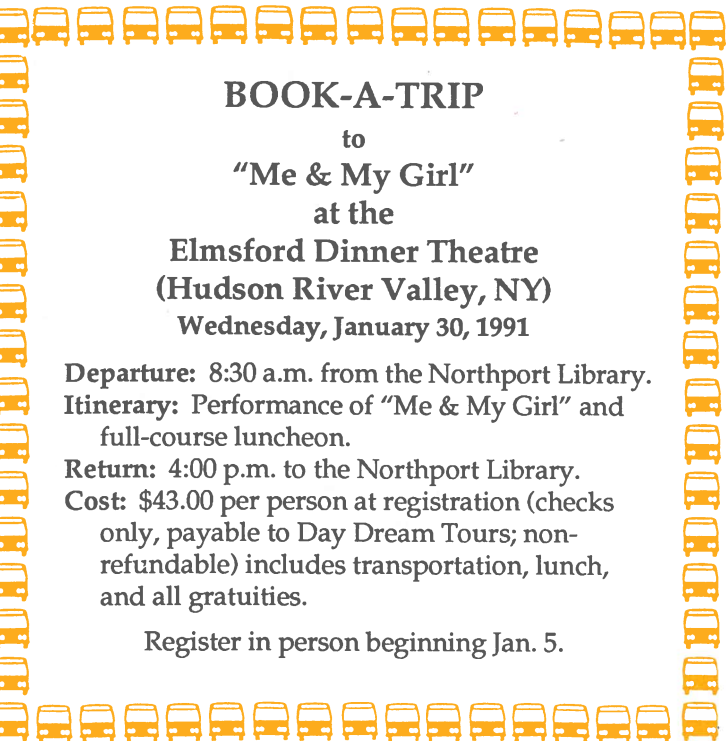
BOOK AND SANDWICH (W)RAP

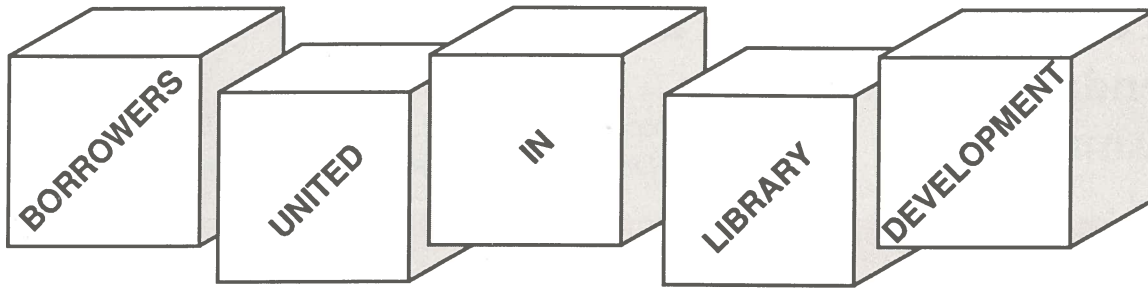

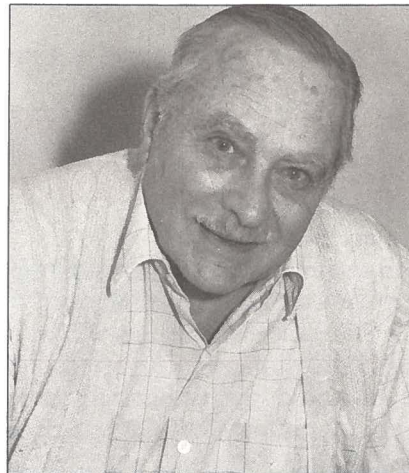

Who's On Board?

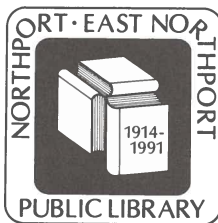
Stuart Goldblatt was first elected to the Northport-East Northport Library Board in 1984, after retiring from his post at Northport High, where, for twenty years, he had taught American history and was, at various times, department head, student ombudsman and tennis coach.

A World War II army veteran, Mr. Goldblatt served in the Middle East, North Africa and Italy from 1942-45. Upon discharge, he was "remarkably lucky" to be admitted to Columbia University. There, thanks to the G.I. Bill, he earned his bachelor's and master's degrees, and — except for the dissertation— completed the requirements for a Ph.D. Married by then to his wife, Jane, Mr. Goldblatt took a teaching job in Cranford, N.J., and remained there for a ten-year period. It was during this time that Donald, Florence and Nick joined the family.

Since his retirement, Mr. Goldblatt has served on the Huntington Board of Assessment Review, as well as on the Library Board, and has maintained his involvement in local politics. Almost every spring, Stu returns to Italy to renew the friendships made there during the war years with his Florentine "family," the Casellis. In recent years, Mr. Goldblatt has also spent some time trying to cheat —er, beat — his #1 granddaughter, Elana (now ten) at Gin Rummy.
