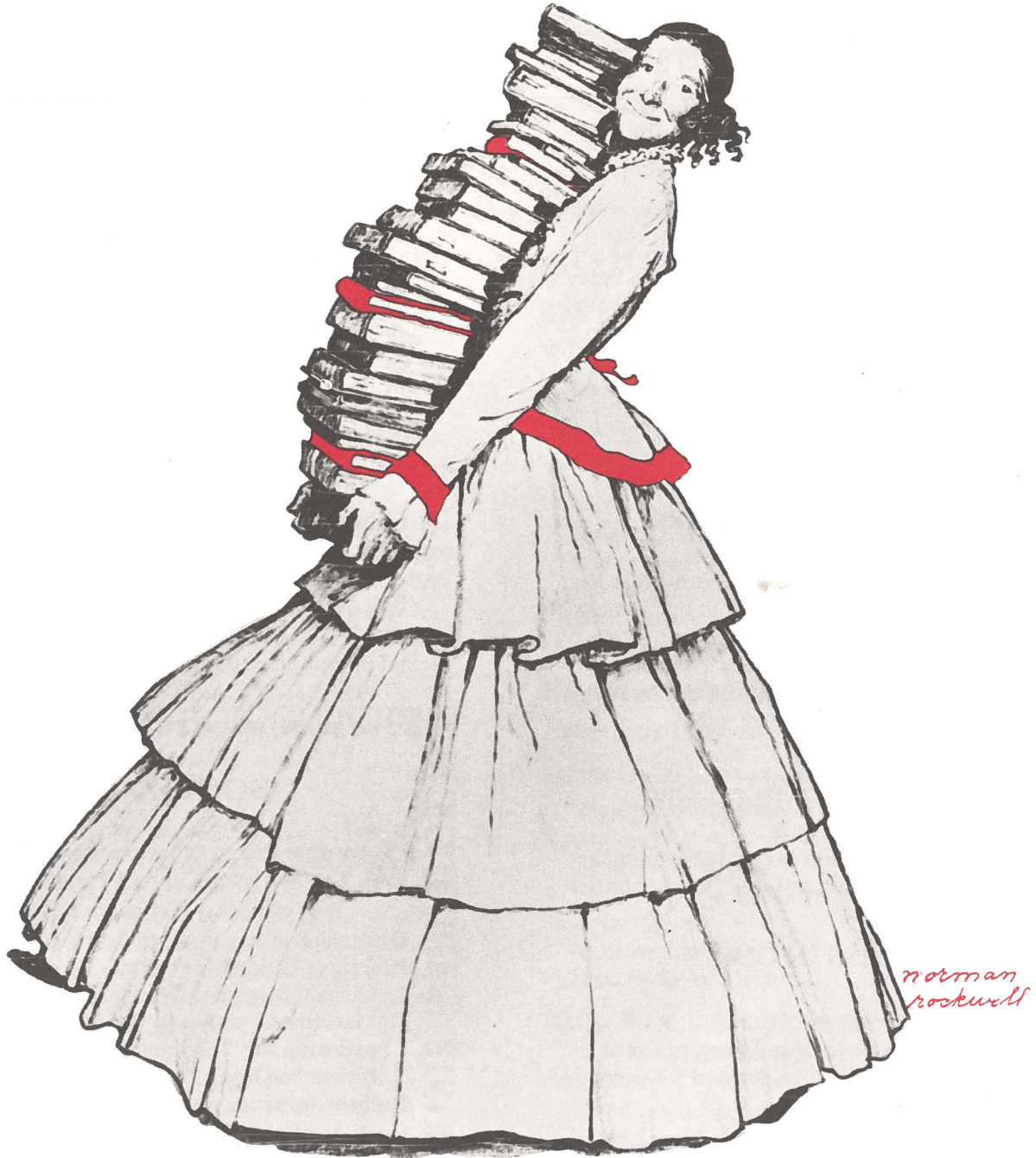

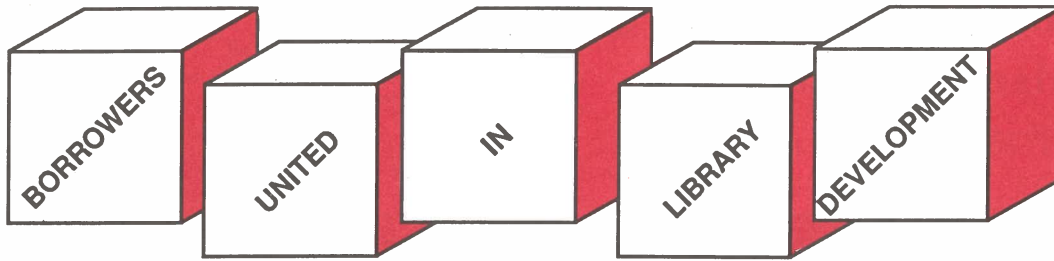

Who's On Board?

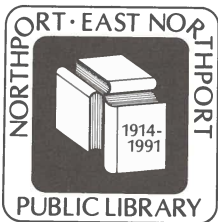
