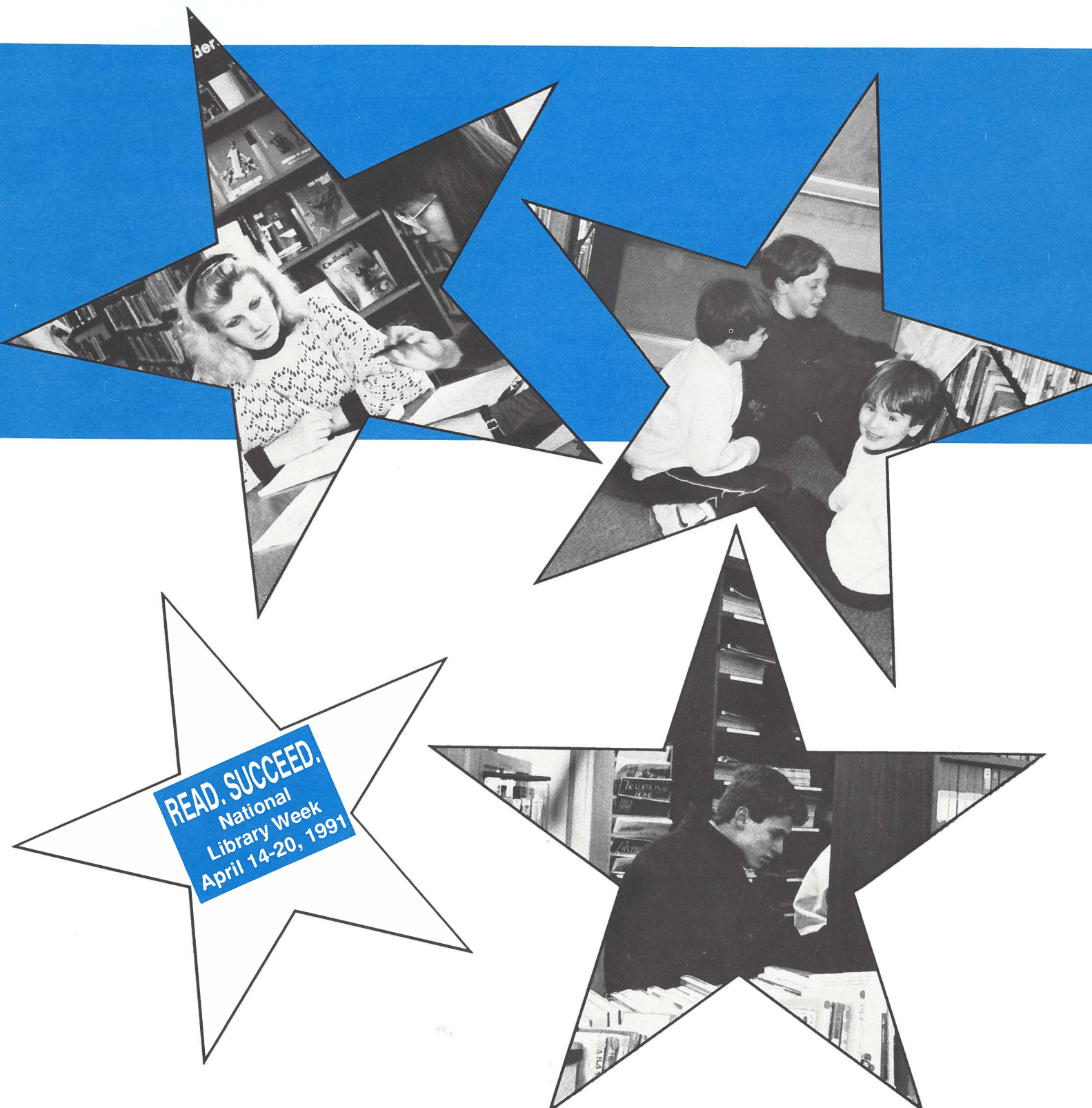

4. You are registered to vote. (You are registered if you have voted within the last two years, in a general, school or library election.)



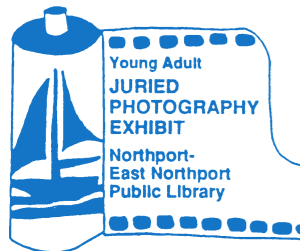

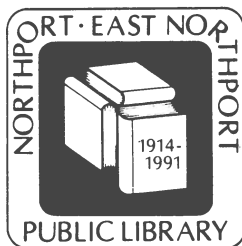
