



During World War I, the American Library Association (ALA) accepted the challenge of providing library service to the armed forces. Federal funds were not allocated for camp libraries, so the ALA conducted two national fundraising campaigns.

To support these campaigns, the ALA distributed publicity materials to libraries, including this 1918 poster.

More than 3 million books were collected and another 2 million were purchased to distribute to camps in the States and abroad.

BOOK & SANDWICH (W)RAP





MEET THE MUSICIAN: CHOPIN


Sunday, November 18 2:00 p.m.


Mrs. Richmond received her bachelor's degree from SUNY Oneonta and a master's
