Public Hearing — Wednesday, March 15 8:15 p.m.

Northport Public Library

Vote — Monday, April 3, from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. Northport Public Library

Trustee — One library trustee will be elected for a five year term

Who Can Vote — anyone who is

1. At least 18 years of age;

2. A citizen of the United States;

3. A resident of the Northport-East Northport School District for at least 30 days; and

4. Registered to vote.

Registration is required if a person has not voted within two years in a general, school, or library election. Register in person at the following locations: 1) any school in the district between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., any day that school is in session; 2) the office of the School District Clerk, 110 Elwood Road, Northport, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; 3) the Suffolk County Board of Elections, Yaphank Avenue, Yaphank, Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; or 4) by mail to the Suffolk County Board of Elections using application forms available in both library buildings.

EAST NORTHPORT NOTES

New Mysteries



We've come a long way, baby! Of the new mystery books which have arrived at East Northport Library recently, more than half were written by women — woman from all over the globe. So move over, Agatha and Josephine, and admit some of these authors to your ranks:

M.C. Beaton, who lives in Scotland, has given us a new hero—Police Constable Hamish Macbeth. In Death Of An Outsider, the third book of a series, he investigates a case of witchcraft in the small town of Cnothan and finds himself involved in a countrywide mystery.

Magdalen Nabb, from Florence, has sent us the latest entry in her Marshall Guarnaccia series. *The Marshall And The Madwoman* begins with Guarnaccia teaching his wife to drive and ends with a solution based on events twenty-five years in the past. Ms. Nabb gives us not only an exciting mystery, but a wonderful picture of life in Florence.

Dorothy Simpson, living in Kent, England, and winner of Britain's Silver Dagger Award, has written her eighth Luke Thanet novel. Inspector Thanet is a sensitive man and cerebral detective who finds his solutions by ferreting out details in the lives of the victims. The victim in *Suspicious Death* is a "rags to riches" career women with many enemies.

From London, by way of South Africa, comes Gillian Slovo, who has written the third in the Kate Baeier mystery series. Private Detective Baeier gets involved in classical music and illicit drugs amid London's "sumptuous West End apartments and exclusive night clubs." Along the way to solving her case, Kate herself is arrested for murder in *Death Comes Staccato*.

Sister Carol Anne O'Marie has written the third mystery starring her unofficial sleuth, Sister Mary Helen, who is sure that God is encouraging her to probe the disappearance of her dear friend, Emma. "Readers who love reading about San Francisco, about police procedure and about the secrets of the human heart will love *The Missing Madonna*."

Finally, closer to home, Clarissa Watson, co-owner and director of the Country Art Gallery in Locust Valley, has given us five mysteries starring Persis Willum, who happens to work in an art gallery in a North Shore Long Island community disguised as Gull Harbor. Coincidence? The basic setting will be familiar to many, but the course of the mystery takes us on trips to Holland and France. The latest of these droll, sly, and jet-setting books is called Somebody Killed The Messenger.

So pull up your chair in front of the fire, throw an afghan over your legs, open one of these intriguing mysteries, and enjoy!



TAMARA AND THE SHADOW THEATRE OF JAVA

(Northport), Sunday, March 5, 3:00 p.m.

There are some 140 to 200 shadow figures in the "Wayang Kulit" repertoire, each representing specific human passions and characteristics. These shadow plays, rarely performed outside of Java, are even less frequently performed by a woman.

Tamara Fielding, a Java-born Long
Islander, and many of her 300 shadow
figures will visit the library for an afternoon of
enchanting entertainment the entire family is

sure to enjoy.

Ms. Fielding, who is of mixed Javanese and Dutch parentage, learned the art as a young girl on her father's rubber plantation. That was highly unusual: the art of puppet master is traditionally passed on from father to son. However, because of her status as the owner's daughter, the Dalang (Javanese Puppet Master) discussed his art with her.

Tamara has lectured and performed this unique Javanese Shadow Theatre at The Museum of Natural History, at The Heckscher Museum in Huntington, as well as for schools throughout the United States.


