IMPORTANT VOTING FACTS

Monday, April 3, 1989 10:00 a.m. - 9:00 p.m.

Voting will be for two purposes: to vote on the library budget for 1989/90 and to elect one trustee (5 year term).

Who Can Vote — anyone who is

- 1. At least 18 years of age;
- 2. A citizen of the United States;
- 3. A resident of the Northport-East Northport School District for at least 30 days; and
- 4. Registered to vote.

Registration is required if a person has not voted within two years in a general, school, or library election. Register in person at one of the following locations by March 29th: 1) any school in the district between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., any day that school is in session; 2) the office of the School District Clerk, 110 Elwood Road, Northport, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; 3) the Suffolk County Board of Elections, Yaphank Avenue, Yaphank, Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; or 4) by mail to the Suffolk County Board of Elections using application forms available in both library buildings.

Vote will take place at the Northport Public Library (Community Room).

NOTE: There is additional general parking in the Northport Junior High School parking lot across the street.

Handicapped voters please use library side ramp for entrance to the polls.


