Children's Door To Learning

Our library encourages young children to develop an interest in reading and learning through services for children, and for parents and children together. The following regularly scheduled programs are offered throughout the year. Enrollment is limited, and pre-registration is required.

MOTHER/INFANT DISCUSSION GROUP INFANTS (2-12 MONTHS) WITH THEIR MOTHERS Conducted by a Registered Nurse, this program encourages mothers to socialize with other mothers while discussing child growth and development.

MOTHER GOOSE
OLDER INFANTS (18-24 MONTHS) WITH THEIR MOTHERS
Through play, a Certified Nursery School Teacher introduces children to the library and to other children.

PARENT/CHILD WORKSHOP TODDLERS (2-2½ YEARS OLD) WITH A PARENT OR CAREGIVER Play with your child — and meet other parents too — in an educational and creative environment. As the children play, we'll explore a different child-related topic each week, and show you related library materials.


