

An Evening With Ambassador Pickering

As part of the continuing festivities for our 75th anniversary, and in celebration of United Nations Disarmament Week, our United States Permanent Representative to the United Nations, Thomas R. Pickering, will speak at the Northport Library on Friday, October 27 at 8:00 p.m.

Ambassador Pickering's topic will be "The United States and the United Nations." During the reception that immediately follows his speech, the Ambassador will have an opportunity to informally answer your questions.

Ambassador Pickering holds the personal rank of Career Ambassador, the highest in the United States Foreign Service. Mr. Pickering has previously served as Ambassador to Israel, to El Salvador, to Nigeria, and to the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan. He has served as Assistant Secretary of State for Oceans and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs, and as a political officer in the 18-Nation Disarmament Conference at Geneva.




