




# MEDICARE/MEDICAID ASSISTANCE

# TRADITIONAL RESOURCES IN TRANSITION

### **INFOTRAC**

allows you to quickly search more than three years of issues of over 1,100 magazines and newspapers for articles written on specific topics. Infotrac's main database indexes topics such as current events, consumer information, arts and entertainment, and business. Most articles are keyed to our MAGAZINE COLLECTION on microfilm. Simply snap a microfilm cartridge into the Collection's Reader/Printer, press the advance button until the correct form is reached, and print the article.

### LE PAC

a CD-ROM union catalog, provides author, title, subject, and keywork access to almost half a million titles in the public libraries of Suffolk County. Our librarians can also access the MILCS database, an online regional catalog listing books held by libraries in the metropolitan area.

### SirS

(The Social Issues Resources Series) is designed to provide timely information on critical problems. This series consists of articles on 32 topics reprinted in their entirety from newspapers, magazines, government documents, and journals. The material is carefully selected to represent a broad spectrum of opinion and complexity.

# MacArthur Foundation Video Collection

Our Library is one of a select group of libraries nationwide that has received a gift of 23 uniquely valuable videos from the Chicagobased John D. and Catherine T. MacArthur Foundation. The videos deal with areas of the Foundation's interest such as health, world environment, peace, and international cooperation. Titles include academy award-winning documentaries such as "Hearts and Minds," and "The Day After Trinity," as well as the BBC award-winning documentary "Points in Space."

begins at both libraries Oct. 30.


### "AMERICA'S TOP 20"
