NON-DRIVER IDENTIFICATION CARDS

Friday, January 22 10:00 a.m. - 12:00 noon

Are you a non-driver? Not having a driver's license can sometimes be a problem. On Friday, January 22 the library will sponsor Project "Reaching Out," a New York State Department of Motor Vehicles service which provides non-driver photo identification cards. In order to participate in this program, you must register and receive an application beginning Saturday, January 9.

Applicants for a non-driver I.D. must be over 18 years old and have proof of age (birth certificate, medical card, etc.) and proof of address (LILCO bill, library card, etc.). If I.D. will replace your driver's license, bring the license with you. A check made out to the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles is also required. The fee will be between \$6.00 and \$6.50. Do not fill in the amount until the program date. Each applicant will receive a temporary identification card. The permanent photo identification will be mailed to your home address within 45 days.
