PRE-RETIREMENT EDUCATION PLANNING FOR MID-LIFE WOMEN

Wednesday evenings, November 2 - December 7 7:30 p.m. (excluding Nov. 23)

The graying of America impacts most heavily on women. Recent research on women, mid-life and older, has indicated a variety of alarming trends. For example, 70% of the elderly poor are women; roughly 50% of all employed women and 80% of retirement-age women have no pension eligibility; 62% of women live alone by the age of sixty-five; less than 10% of widows receive their husband's pension benefits.

Long Island University's Southampton Campus has established a series of workshops entitled Pre-Retirement Education Planning for Mid-Life Women (PREP) to address the pre-retirement needs of working women between the ages of 35-55. Based upon the dismal economic picture that many older women face today, the goal of these workshops is to prepare women for a more secure, independent old age. The six sessions, led by professional women, will explore such areas as financial planning, health, employment, and the social/emotional issues of growing older. This special program is funded by the Department of Health and Human Services in collaboration with the National Council on Aging. No registration is necessary.

REMEMBERING KRISTALLNACHT

"Night of the Broken Glass" November 9-10, 1938

With attacks on thousands of Jews, their property and synagogues, Kristallnacht marked the end of independent Jewish life in Germany and Austria. All cultural and community groups were dissolved and the Jewish press was banned.

On November 9th at 10:00 a.m. in the Northport Library, Ruth Minsky Sender will share with us her experiences as a survivor of the Nazi holocaust. Her book, *The Cage*, a vivid memoir of a woman who lost her youth to the Nazis, focuses on the destruction of the Jewish family, community, and life style — all goals of the Nazis when they engineered Kristallnacht.

This book has received wide critical acclaim. Its sequel, *To Life*, has just recently been published. Join us for a powerful and emotional remembrance of 50 years ago when "The Night of the Broken Glass" foreshadowed the fate of millions of European Jews.
