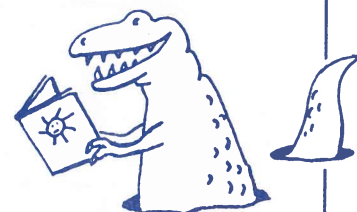

## REFERENCE HELP ON CD-ROM

Two reference tools, the *Magazine Index* and *Books in Suffolk Libraries* have been improved thanks to laser disk technology. *Infotrac*, which uses the *Magazine Index Plus* database, now allows you to search for articles on a subject using a computer keyboard. *Books In Long Island Libraries* is the new name for the discs that list books owned by public, academic, and special libraries on Long Island. Printers are attached to both of these. Ask a Reference Librarian for a demonstration.
