# JAZZ PIANIST DAVE JASEN Friday, March 21, 8:30 p.m.

Internationally acclaimed ragtime pianist and composer Dave Jasen will appear in a concert co-sponsored by International Art of Jazz. Mr. Jasen's recordings include Rip-Roarin' Ragtime and Rompin' Stompin' Ragtime. He has also co-authored Rags and Ragtime, a comprehensive history of this native American music. # LONG ISLAND DRINKING WATER: IS IT SAFE? Thursday, March 20, 7:30 p.m.



One of the most serious environmental problems facing the resi-

dents of Long Island today is the contamination of the ground-water supply, which is our source of drinking water. Mr. Christopher Visco, Adjunct Professor of Marine Science at Dowling College and a teacher in the Sachem Public School District, will present a slide lecture on this timely topic. Mr. Visco will cover essential information for homeowners such as how to have water tested, types of filter systems available for the home, and the health effects of various pollutants. Admission is free.

## **NEWS FROM THE REFERENCE DEPARTMENT**

Looking for a novel rich in history and international intrigue? Why not try The Adventures of Jeremiah Dimon: A Novel of Old East Hampton, by Everett T. Rattray. Set in the South Fork of Long Island in 1887, the story follows the adventures of a young man whose wanderlust leads him from Sag Harbor to the Caribbean. The late Everett Rattray was editor and publisher of the East Hampton Star and a prominent Long Island historian. The Adventures of Jeremiah Dimon won the Pushcart Press's 1985 Editor's Book Award.

Another new book in our collection is Foods of Long Island, by Peggy Katalinich. This beautiful volume (a photograph of Northport Harbor graces the cover) includes over 250 recipes that celebrate the bounty of Long Island's food and wine.

**VOTE** - Tuesday, April 1 from 10:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. at the Northport Library.

**TRUSTEE** - One Library Trustee will be elected for a five year term.

## WHO CAN VOTE - Anyone who is:

1. At least 18 years of age;

2. A citizen of the United States;

3. A resident of Northport-East Northport School District for at least 30 days;

4. Is registered to vote.

Preregistration is required if a person has not voted within two years in a general, school, or library election. Registration may be made in person at the following locations: 1) any school in the district between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 p.m., any day that school is in session; 2) at the offices of the School District Clerk, 110 Elwood Road, Northport, Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.; 3) at the Suffolk County Board of Elections, Yaphank Avenue, Yaphank, Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.; and 4) by mail to the Suffolk County Board of Elections using application forms available at both Library buildings.



# THE RETURN OF HALLEY'S COMET Tuesday, March 11, 7:30 p.m.


Halley's Comet was first observed as early as 240 B.C. by ancient Chinese astronomers. This year, it is making its 30th recorded appearance, 76 years after its last pass. To celebrate this rare event, Mr. Thomas Affatigato from Vanderbilt Planetarium, will join us to discuss the history of comets, how different cultures in different times have viewed them, and the chemistry and orbital properties of comets. Mr. Affatigato will also describe the positions and viewing times for Halley's Comet and he will distribute finding charts. Admission is free and all are welcome.


