



HELP FOR THE HEARING IMPAIRED

Libraries are in the business of providing information, and transmitting that information to hearing impaired persons may involve the use of special materials and communication skills on the part of librarians. Deaf individuals with access to TTY (teletypewriter) equipment may now call Reading For The Handicapped (a service of the Suffolk County Library System) at 286-4546, for telephone reference assistance Monday through Friday, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Other free services from Reading for the Handicapped include signed English books, signed video cassettes and special headphones for hard-of-hearing patrons who use talking books. For additional information about any of these services ask at the reference desk at either library.

VIDEO NEWS

The video collection now includes an important new film, *Strong Kids*, *Safe Kids*, donated by the Northport Neighborhood Watch Association.
