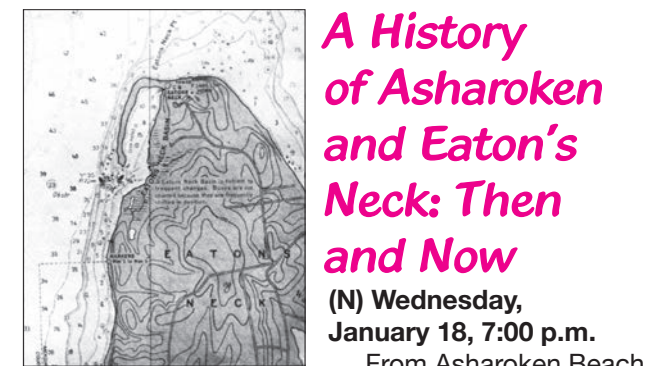

Short Story Central

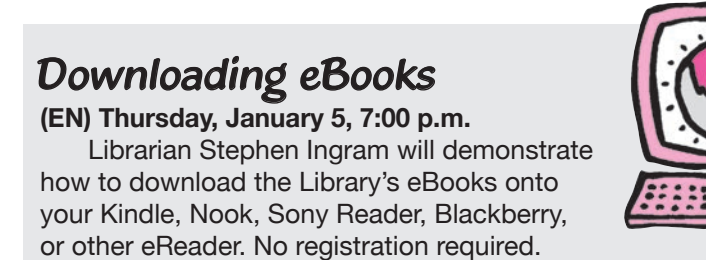
