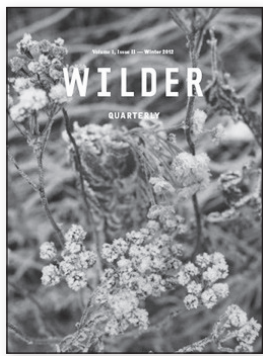


Book-A-Trip to Ellis Island Friday, August 3, 2012
