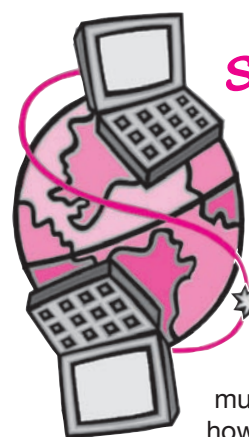
(N) Sunday, January 31, 2:00 p.m.

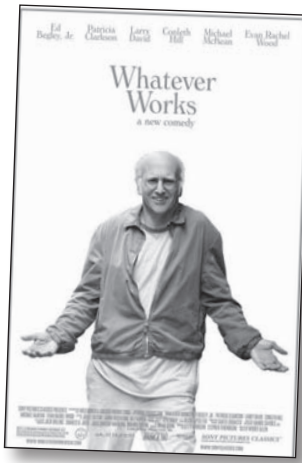

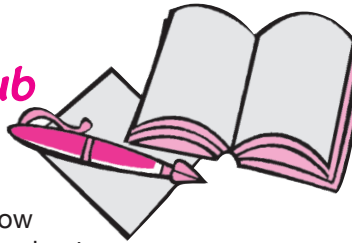

Nationally Recognized Four-Star Library

Northport-East Northport Public Library Receives Four-Star Accolade, Again!

In its November 2009 issue, *Library Journal* announced the second round of national library ratings, once again ranking the Northport-East Northport Public Library among the top 3.5% of the nation's public libraries scored by the *LJ Index* and naming it a "four-star library" among "America's Star Libraries." *Library Journal's* national rating, entitled the *LJ Index of Public Library Service*, offers an overall indication of how a library's performance stacks up to peer libraries and provides guidance on how all public libraries can better assess and improve what they provide to their users. The "four-star library" rating is based on four representative service outputs — circulation, patron visits, program attendance, and public Internet usage. Media attention in the last year has focused on the key role libraries are playing during the current economic crisis. The *LJ Index* rating identifies 258 libraries nationwide that are delivering exceptional service. The Northport-East Northport Public Library is honored to receive this national recognition from *Library Journal*, the oldest and most respected publication covering the library field. Step Outside... Enjoy Nature!

Get inspired to go outside and take a deep breath of fresh air! Our new exhibit in the Museum Cove, located in the Children's Department of the Northport Library, challenges you to do just that. The outdoor world of Long Island has so much to offer, no matter what the season, and we will be highlighting some of the simple ways to connect with nature right in our own backyards. From mid-January through May, we will be partnering with the Islip-based Seatuck Environmental Association to bring colorful displays and thought-provoking programs to our Library for people of all ages to enjoy. Our goal: to have no child—or adult—left inside!

Seatuck, a not-for-profit organization dedicated to conserving Long Island wildlife, has recently joined with Suffolk County to establish a new nature center at the 70-acre Scully Estate on South Bay Road in Islip. The Suffolk County Environmental Center, as the facility will be known, offers a rich diversity of habitats and wildlife and boasts a one-of-a-kind Normandy-style mansion. When the Environmental Center opens to the public in April of this year, it will include educational exhibits, a network of trails, and a full schedule of activities for children and adults. Plans for an outdoor classroom are also in the works. It will be a perfect place to get outdoors and enjoy nature!

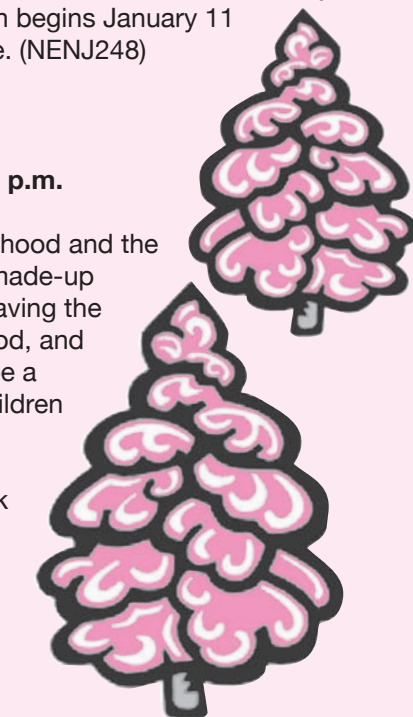
