Video Killed the Radio Star: The History of Music Videos

Barcode Basics

All items added to our print and media collections at the Library are identified as being owned by the Library and include our address, a pocket for a due date slip, a call number label to locate the item, and most importantly a 14-digit barcode such as 30605001884832. Barcodes are affixed using a specially designed template to facilitate scanning the item at check-out. The placement of barcodes is set by the template, depending on the size of the item, and therefore, on occasion, barcodes may cover a picture or descriptive information.

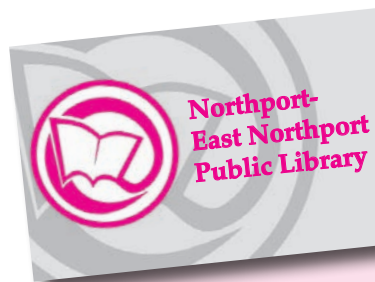


New on the Library's Website

Library Receives Grant

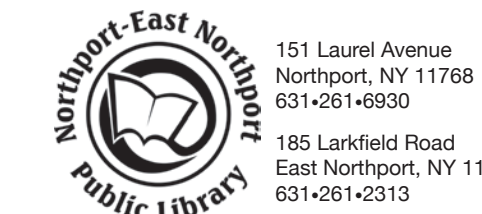

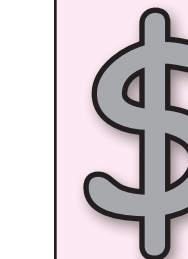


The Library... A Consumer's Best Friend
