Climate Change and Storm Surge Threats to Long Island

He has also done volunteer work for the U.S. Bureau of Land Management in their wild horse preservation program. All are welcome.

A Reminder to SuffolkWeb Dial-up Users

Last year, the Suffolk Cooperative Library System (SCLS) announced that it would be ending its SuffolkWeb dial-up Internet service effective December 31, 2007. After this date, library patrons will no longer be able to use SuffolkWeb as their Internet service provider. SCLS began the dial-up Internet project more than a decade ago. Since then, the dramatic increase in broadband Internet access has led to a significant decline in dial-up usage. The Suffolk Cooperative Library System will continue to maintain and support SuffolkWeb email accounts and this change will not affect the ability to access the Internet at the library. 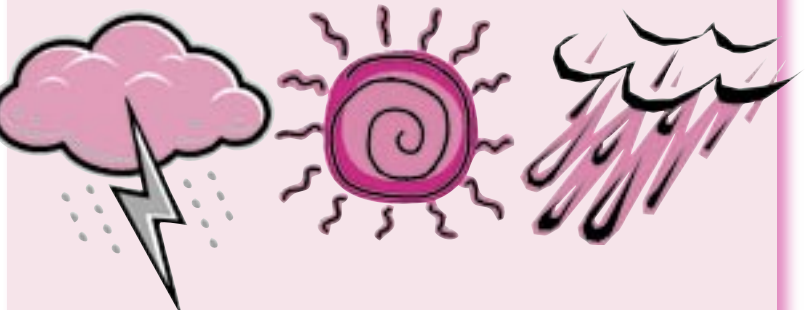

Have you ever wondered what hurricane hunters see in the sky as they ride into a roaring hurricane? Have you ever admired the beauty of lightning in the summer sky? Planet Earth has a variety of amazing weather events. Pretend you're a meteorologist, and experience some of these events at our **Extreme Weather Exhibit**, presented in conjunction with the Long Island Science Center, in the Museum Cove of the Northport Public Library.

The Long Island Science Center is located in Riverhead on the Peconic River. The Science Center's mission is "to promote the knowledge and love of math, science and technology" in an interactive learning environment. It is also a source of scientific information for teachers and families. The Science Center uses interactive exhibits and demonstrations to encourage the learning process. For our display, they have lent us various weather instruments, a survival kit, and tornado and wave models.

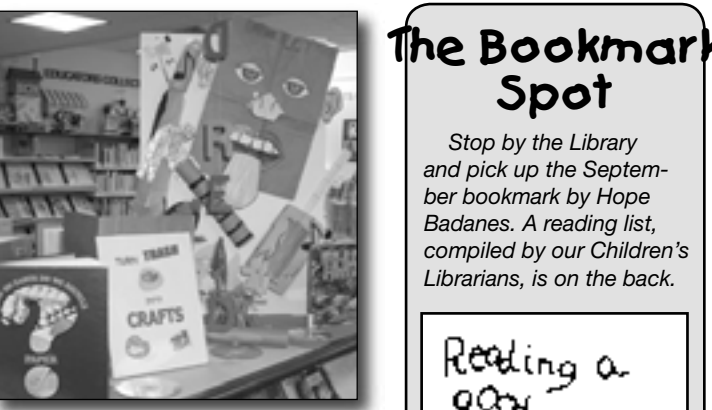

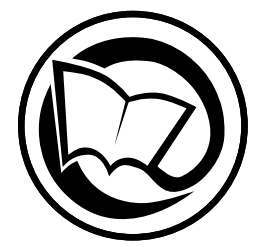

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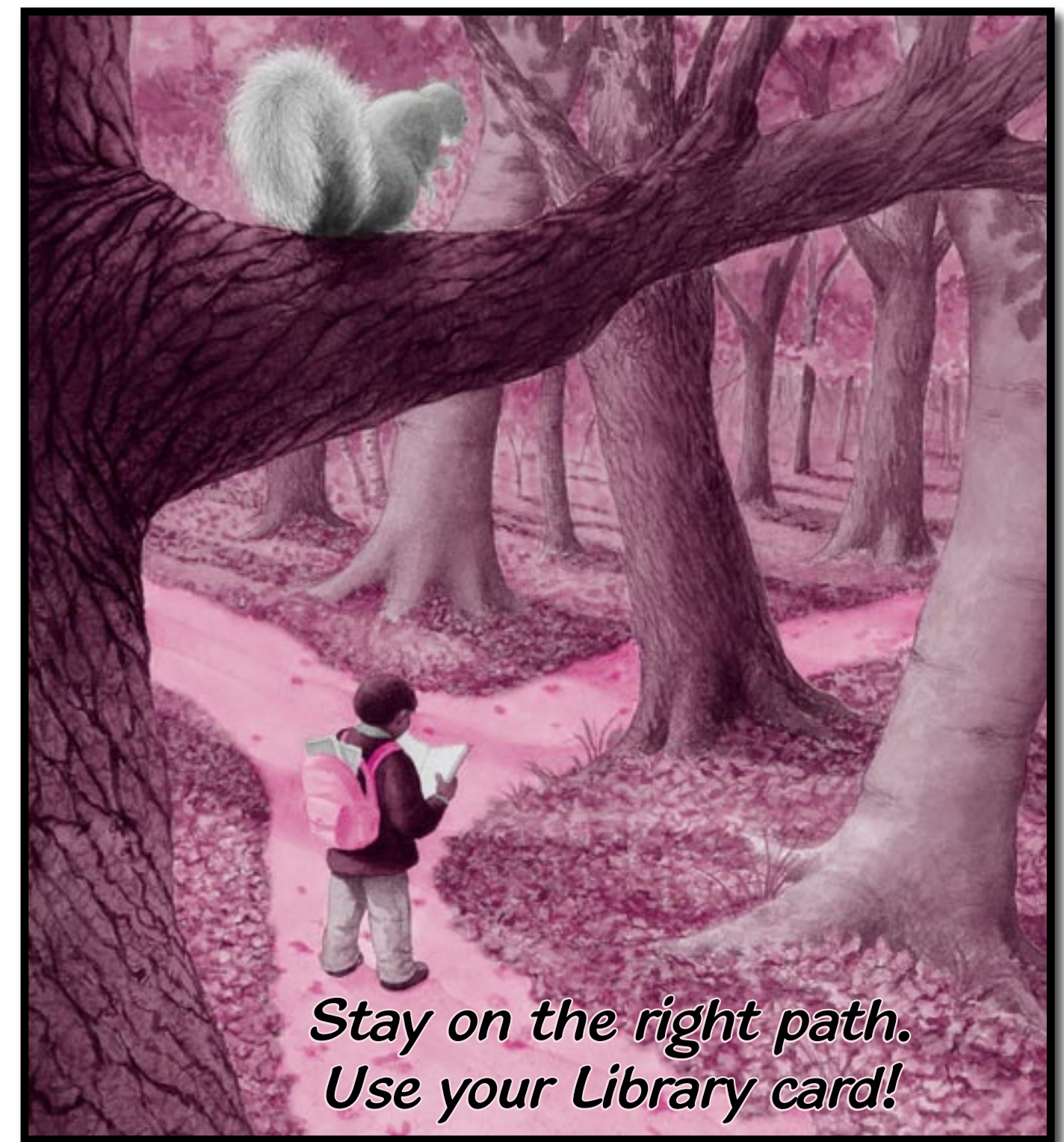
