The Board of Trustees has set the annual Library Vote for Tuesday, April 4, 2006. Voting will be for two purposes: to vote on the Library budget for 2006/2007 and to elect TWO (2) Library Trustees: one to fill a five-year term commencing July 1, 2006 and ending on June 30, 2011 as a result of the expiration of the term of office presently held by Ruth McKay; the other to fill a three-year term commencing July 1, 2006 and ending on June 30, 2009 as a result of the vacancy of the position held by William Martin. Petitions for nominating candidates for the office of trustee will be available from the Clerk of the Library Vote at the Northport Library, 151 Laurel Avenue, Monday through Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., beginning February 13. The last filing date is March 6, 2006.

Down to the Sea in Ships



The Museum Cove at the Northport Public Library is proud to present "Down to the Sea in Ships," a special exhibit from the Long Island Maritime Museum. Long Island's history is firmly rooted in maritime life, including shipbuilding, sailing, fishing, and oyster harvesting. We welcome children to discover this unique way of life.

The Long Island Maritime Museum was founded in 1966 and is dedicated "to preserve Long Island's rich maritime history and heritage for educational purposes." Located on the West Sayville waterfront, the 14-acre site was formerly the Meadow Edge estate of Mrs. Florence Bourne Hard. The five historic buildings house various exhibits including local half models,

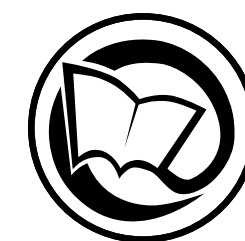

Long Island shipwrecks, and a display of over 30 full-size boats of all types. Visitors can tour the boat basin where some of the Museum's floating collection of boats are moored. The Maritime Museum also sponsors special events such as a Seafood Festival & Craft Show, a Halloween Boat Burning, art shows, and children's art/science classes.

The Northport Library's exhibit, "Down to the Sea in Ships," will open in February and continue until June.

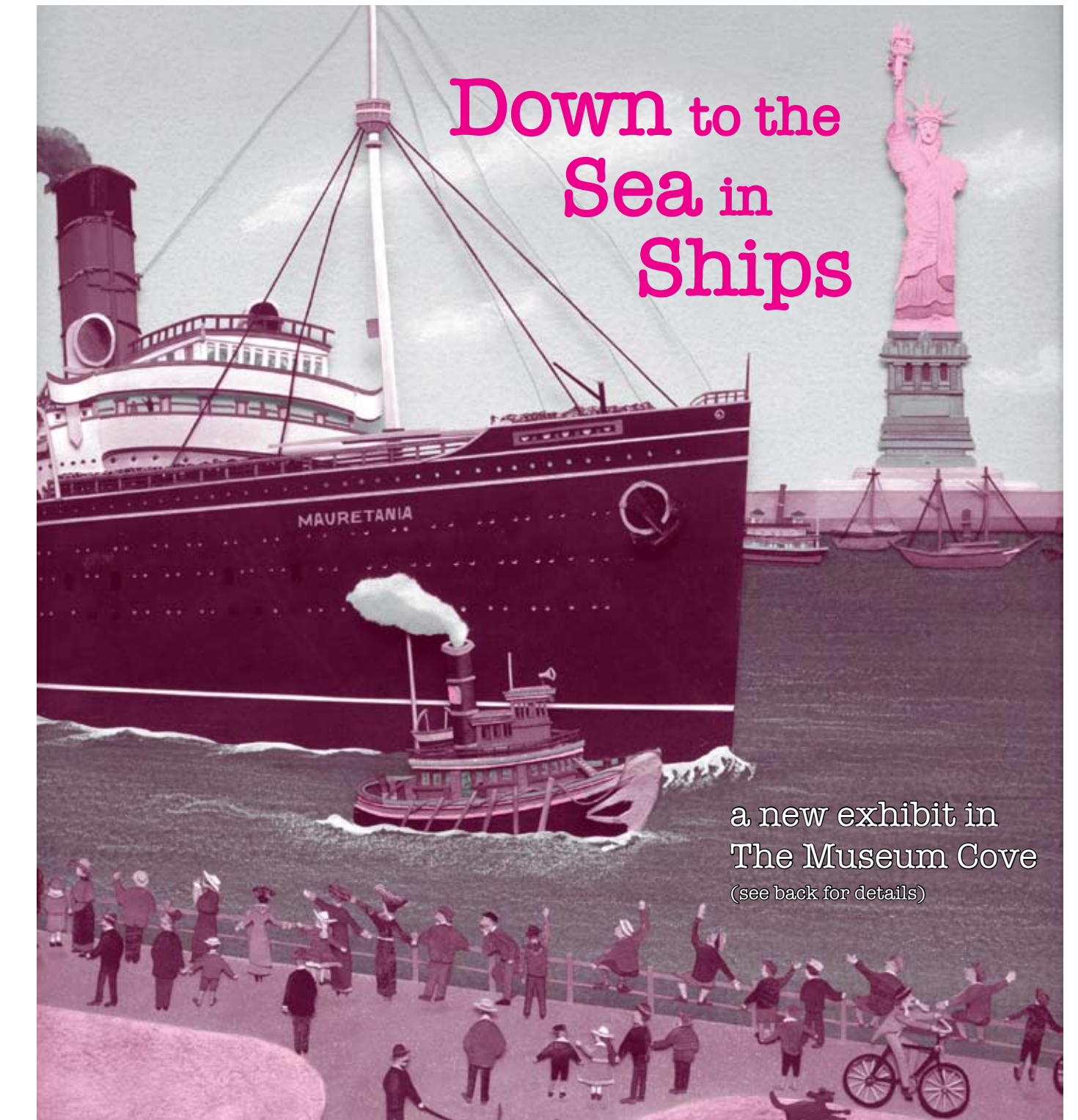
