VOICES presents "The Miracle Worker"

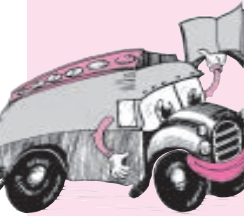
(N) **Friday, August 6, 7:30 p.m.**

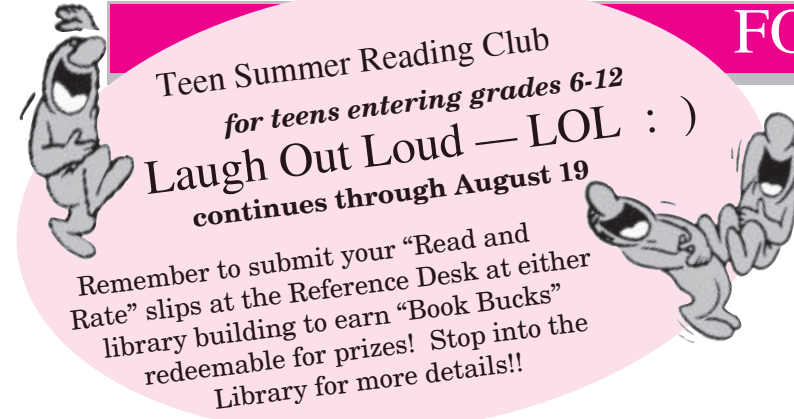

Years of Change, 1940-1960

During World War II and in the years that followed, the Library took on new projects and strengthened its services. In support of the war effort it collected donations of books to send to troops overseas, and Red Cross volunteers used the library meeting room to prepare surgical dressings.

After the war, the Library added resources and services in response to both a nationwide movement to improve libraries and the Northport-East Northport community's population surge. The collection grew from 10,000 volumes in 1945 to more than 40,000 in 1960. During the same period, borrowers increased from 2,000 to almost 12,000. Book displays, art exhibits, and author talks became regular library activities. Both library buildings rearranged their limited space to accommodate separate children's rooms and enhanced service with story hours and visits for school children.

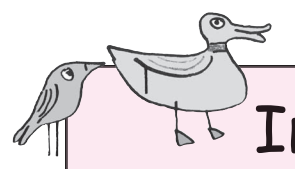

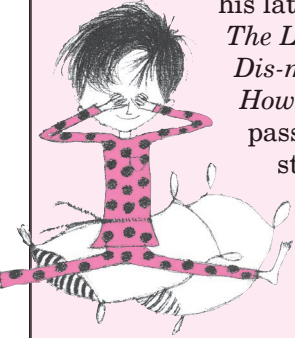
In The Museum Cove: The Art of Bill Sokol

The Museum Cove at the Northport Public Library is pleased to present an exhibit featuring the art and book illustrations of Bill Sokol. Born in 1923 in Warsaw, Poland, Mr. Sokol lived in Northport for many years until his death in 2004. He worked as an advertising director, graphic arts director, easel painter, and illustrator. He received many awards during his career at the *New York Times* as well as for his children's book illustrations.

Mr. Sokol illustrated many popular children's books including the funny Alvin Fernald series by Clifford B. Hicks, *Time Cat* by Lloyd Alexander, and *A Child's Book of Dreams* by Beatrice Schenk DeRegnier. Mr. Sokol worked with prestigious children's book editor Nonny Hogrogian and he contributed artwork to the Children's Book Council to promote Children's Book Week. He illustrated four books for his late wife Camille Sokol including: *The Lucky Sew-it-Yourself Book* (1964), *Dis-moi* (1963), *La Pluche* (1963), and *How to Be Mother's Helper*. Mrs. Sokol passed away in 1970 but her books are still enjoyed by children in our community.

Bill Sokol wrote and illustrated two books: *A Lion in the Tree* (1961) and *The Fable of Proffit the Fox* (1964). Other children's books illustrated by Bill Sokol include:

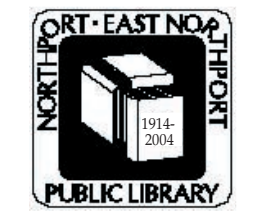

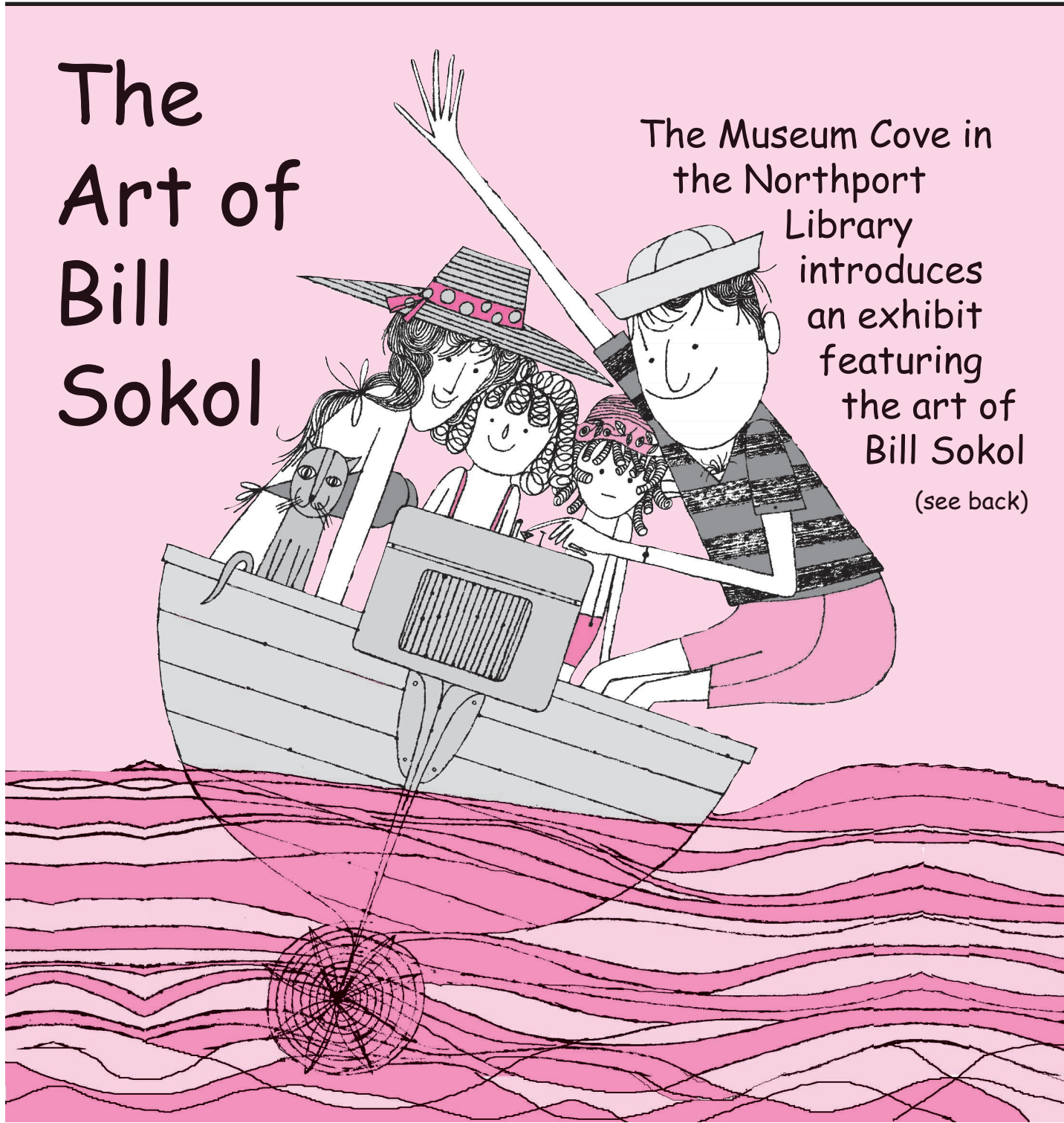
