Expansion, 1960-1966

Fifty years after the construction of the Carnegie Library on Main Street, the Library faced seriously crowded conditions. The district's population had grown from 9,500 in 1950 to 28,000 in 1960. Assistant Library Director Miklos Zsedely described the Northport Library as follows: "The main floor of this building is literally covered with shelves, circulation desk, microfilm cabinets, newspaper rack, periodical rack, and vertical files, which leave space for only twenty-three to sit and for no one to walk...There should be about 13,000 books in a building of its size. It now holds some 30,000."

In 1963 the community voted to purchase land for a new library at the corner of Laurel and Scudder Avenues. Soon after, they voted to build a 20,000 square foot building on the site and expand the library in East Northport. Construction was completed in 1966. The Northport building included space for the special art book collection and a meeting room with seating for 100. The extension to the East Northport Library added book stack areas that created space for a larger children's room and for seating and reference resources in the adult area.






