Northport Rotary Club Memorial Jazz Concert presents **Cynthia Sayer, Jazz Banjoist**

Say jazz trumpet and most fans think of Dizzy Gillespie. Say jazz sax and you might think of Charlie Parker. Say jazz banjo and you'll probably say . . . *jazz what?*

Yes, jazz banjo! And this year, the Library's guest for the annual Northport Rotary Club Memorial Jazz Concert is an internationally acknowledged virtuoso of the jazz banjo . . . Cynthia Sayer. Also acclaimed for her vocal and multi-instrumental talents, Ms. Sayer is the pianist and vocalist with Woody Allen's New Orleans Jazz Band. She tours regularly and has performed at concerts worldwide, along with such artists as Dick Hyman, Milt Hinton, and Marvin Hamlisch. Her film and soundtrack credits include *Purple Rose of Cairo*, *Sophie's Choice*, and *Bullets Over Broadway*. She was the banjoist with the New York Philharmonic performances of *Rhapsody in Blue*, conducted by Kurt Masur. Her albums "The Jazz Banjo of Cynthia Sayer," (with Milt Hinton and Dick Wellstood), "More Jazz Banjo" (with Bucky Pizzarelli and Dick Wellstood), and "Forward Moves" (with Kenny Davern) were noted by *Cadence Magazine* as top ten classic jazz releases.

Ms. Sayer will be joined by Jon Erik Kellso on trumpet, Dan Levinson on clarinet, and Vince Giordano on string bass and sax.

The audience will have the opportunity to meet the performers and enjoy refreshments during the concert intermission. Tickets for this performance are available at the Northport and East Northport Libraries beginning October 16. Tickets are \$1 for adults, 50¢ for students, senior citizens, and persons with disabilities.

Computer resources for all your needs



- The Library's **Online Public Access Catalog (OPAC)**, may be accessed from terminals throughout both libraries. The user-friendly OPAC lets you search for books, videos, and other materials by author, title, subject, or a unique word.
- **Reference PCs** contain the Library's Virtual Reference Collection, a group of Internet-accessible databases which have been selected by librarians to provide access to high quality resources.
- **Application computers**, located in the computer centers and YA areas in both libraries, provide word processing, spreadsheet, presentation, and database software.
- **Internet computers**, located in the Reference, Young Adult, and Children's areas of our libraries, are dedicated to Internet searching.
- **The Art Mezzanine** at the Northport Library contains a multimedia computer with various databases of interest to art world professionals as well as researchers and students.
- **Children's Services computers** with educational software are available in both libraries. Children's Services reference computers have various information databases; their application computers have wordprocessing software. There are dedicated Internet computers in both libraries.

The Virtual Reference Collection . . .

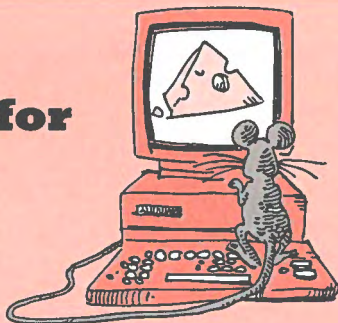
Project Adventure for Parents

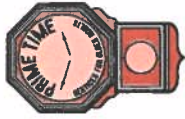

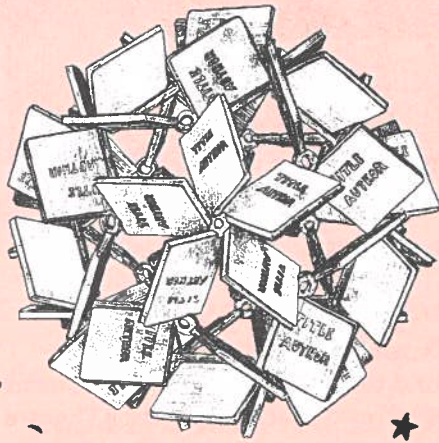

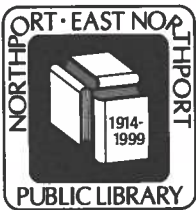
